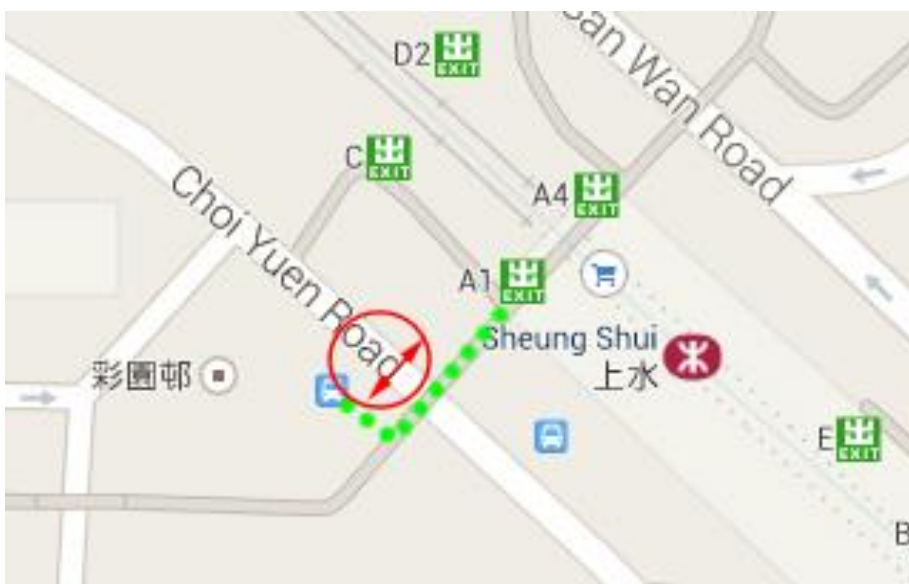

## 1. Location: Choi Yuen Road (Sheung Shui MTR Station)

**Problem: Missing crossing between MTR station and bus stop**

Although Choi Yuen Road is the main road of Sheung Shui with high traffic flow, there is high pedestrian demand at the concerned location. The footbridges are inconvenient for users, especially elderly. We recommend a street-level crossing on Choi Yuen Road to allow pedestrians to cross at ground level and access the bus stops and the taxi stands easily. The demand is clearly there judging from the number of people jay-walking at that location. As a separate question, when will the lifts be installed at those footbridges?
